# CAMP SEQUOYAH CAMPSITE AWARD SCORESHEET

## Tents:

- Neat and orderly –Some tents may be missing ties; points will not be taken off for this reason. Flaps may be closed or folded or rolled back over the tent roof. Litter should not be present in tents. (It's often good to open your tent flaps to air out your tent during the day, weather permitting).
- Bedding (sleeping bags, pillows, and blankets) should be in neat arrangement on the cot.
- Clothing should be folded neatly on top of the bedding, hung inside the tent, or stored in packs or baggage.
- Clothes lines should be strung so that they do not present a ripping or strangling situation. They should be out of pathways used by campers. It is acceptable to use rope to clothesline or personal fan inside of your tent.

## Fire Protection

- If you choose to have a fire, please ensure that fire tools are readily stored near the fire ring with easy access. This makes a good pioneering project.
- The campfire area should be neat and free of litter. You are free to burn downed wood that you find in and around your campsite. Do NOT cut down any trees. Many unit will bring their own firewood with them. All combustible material should be 10 feet away from the fire itself.

## Troop and Patrol Areas

- Each campsite has 1 or 2 garbage bins. These need to be emptied each morning and as needed. The dumpsters are located on the side of the Dining Hall. Trash bags are available at the commissary.
- Feel free to use your own Duty Roster. If you need a Duty Roster, as your campsite host for one.
- The Camp Schedule and Merit Badge Schedule should be on the board when you arrive. If they are not there or are damaged, please talk to your campsite host and ensure they are replaced.
- No vehicles are allowed in campsite unless authorize by the Commissioner. A deduction of 5 points for each unauthorized vehicle will be made.

## Bathrooms and Showers

- Our goal is to make the bathrooms and showers as comfortable as possible. There is a hose adjacent to the buildings along with a plunger, a brush, and a broom. While points will not be deducted for spider webs, please knock down spider webs as part of your daily cleaning.

## Scout Spirit

- Having a new camp gadget each day is encouraged. Use of lashing should be visible. Tool holders, weather rock, towel racks, tables, and chairs that are lashed from rope or twine are examples of camp gadgets.
- Please bring means of displaying the US and Troop flag. Our campsites do not have build in flag poles.
- Patrol flags show Scout spirit and help unify the patrol. Points are given for flags being created and also completed.
- Troop or Patrol gateways mark the entrance to your campsite. The amazing gateway competition is separate from the campsite award. Points are given based on scale and creativity.
