

Job Description: Climbing Director

Essential Functions:

- The Climbing Director reports directly to the Program Director and Camp Director.
- The Climbing Director must be at least 21 years old.
- The Climbing Director must have enough physical endurance to lead and participate in climbing sessions and must hold a valid certification from BSA National Camping School.

(The Greater Alabama Council will pay for all BSA National Camping School expenses to be certified.)

Principle Responsibilities:

- Supervise, train, and motivate the Climbing Instructor staff in all their activities.
- Ensure BSA Climbing standards and all safety regulations are followed.
- Lead and instruct participants who are earning the Climbing Merit Badge.
- Direct the set-up and takedown of a program area.
- Maintain the inventory of all climbing equipment.
- Teach Climb on Safely to adult leaders.
- Participate in all camp wide activities.
- Collecting/preparing Advancement Report Cards, MB Cards and other paperwork as needed.
- Ensure control and security of climbing equipment and program materials. Ensure that
 equipment is maintained properly. Maintain current and accurate inventories of
 program materials, supplies and equipment. Specifically, keep all required
 rope/harness/helmet/other equipment logs up to date in accordance with National
 Camp Standards.
- Assist in the set-up and takedown of all campsite facilities.
- During the end of the summer camping season, complete a written close-out report of the Climbing program that should include an inventory of all equipment, including equipment condition and recommendations for next year's supplies. The report will be submitted to the Program Director and Camp Director before leaving the camp property.
- All other duties as assigned.
